We believe that the Japan Confederation of Atomic and Hydrogen Bomb Suffers Organization, which has long lead the world in nuclear disarmament, receiving the Nobel Peace Prize last year will accelerate the nuclear disarmament of the world.

We, the residents of Tomakomai, pray that this conference, which marks eighty years since the tragedies at Hiroshima and Nagasaki, will be fruitful and that it serves as a step towards a world without nuclear weapons. For that purpose, we offer this message.
