Industry of Tomakomai

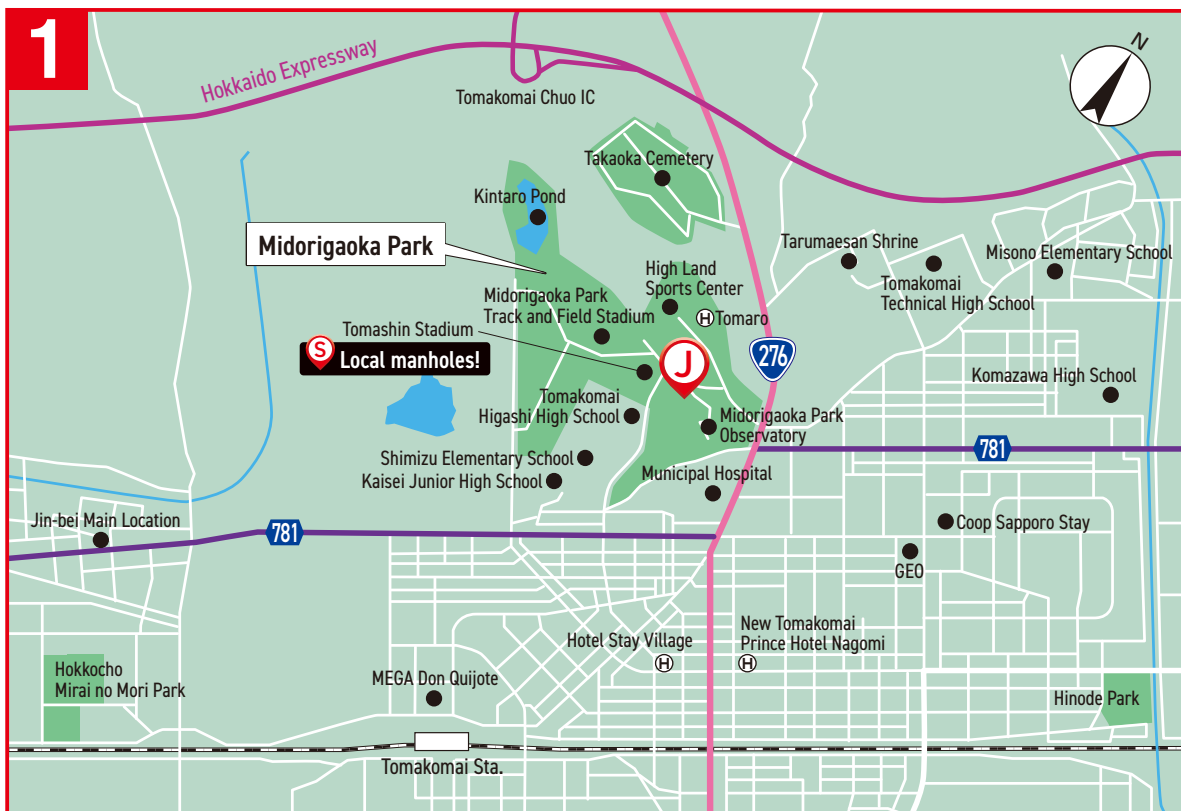

Lake Utonai



Lake Utonai is said to be a treasure trove of flora and fauna and a paradise for wild birds. More than 270 species of birds have been confirmed to date, and birdwatching and nature walks allow visitors to enjoy nature and encounter wild birds all year round. It is a particularly important stopover for migratory birds such as geese, ducks, and swans, and is internationally known as a mass migration site for white-fronted geese and swans.



Ramsar Convention Registered Wetland (1991)

Lake Utonai in the Yufutsu Wilderness was the first wetland in Japan designated as a bird sanctuary by the Wild Bird Society of Japan. The Nature Center not only conducts environmental surveys and conservation, but also widely showcases the rich natural environment through nature observation, hands-on learning, and various events.



Lake Utonai Observation Facility



It is a 17-meter-high observation facility with an observation deck on the rooftop. A live camera is installed to capture images of the surface of Lake Utonai, which can be viewed on a monitor inside the facility, and there is also a children's space and a nursing room for small children.

Mt. Tarumae



This volcano is known as a triple active volcano, a rarity in the world. It takes about 60 minutes by car from the city to the seventh station hut, and about 50 minutes from the seventh station to the summit (closed in winter). The mountain is well known for its alpine flora, magnificent views of Lake Shikotsu and the Pacific Ocean, and as a mountain where you can enjoy full-fledged trekking first hand.

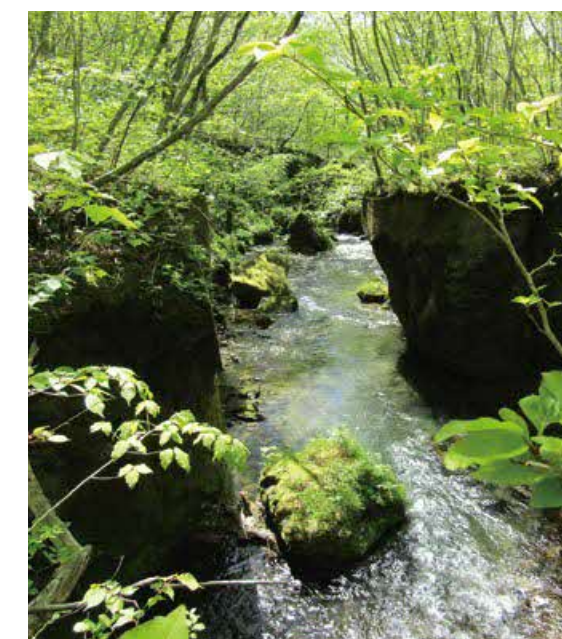


Tarumae Garo



Tarumae Garo was designated as a municipal nature conservation area in 1979 and is located in the forest at the foot of Mt. Tarumae. The sheer rock formations create a unique landscape, and the rock surfaces are covered with around 100 varieties of dark green mosses, resembling a velvet carpet.

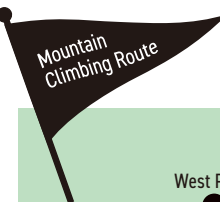

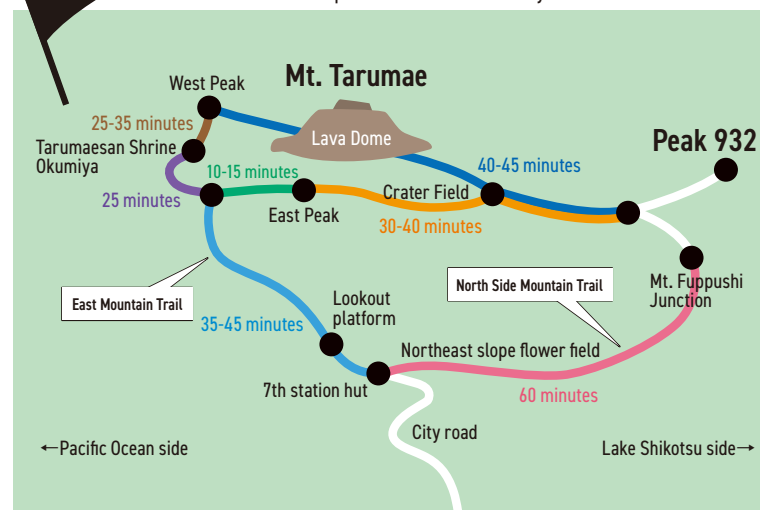

Origin of the mountain's name

In the Ainu language, *taor-oma-i* means "high place on the riverbank," or "something that exists there". The Ainu generally did not give names to mountains that referred to the mountains themselves, but rather named them the upstream (water source) of this river, so it is highly likely that the name Mt. Tarumae refers to the present-day Tarumae River, which runs down the south side of the mountain, rather than to the mountain itself. This water source is said to be the origin of the name Mt. Tarumae.

When it comes to Tomakomai's food, the first thing that comes to mind is Sakhalin surf clams, which Tomakomai boasts the largest catch of in Japan. It has been certified as a regional collective trademark brand by the Japan Patent Office. Enjoy Tomakomai's delicacies such as Sakhalin surf clams and other marine products as well as agricultural products such as blue honeysuckle.



Tomakomai, "the No. 1 place for Sakhalin surf clam in Japan," is famous for its Sakhalin surf clam curry!

The roux in which the Sakhalin surf clam is stewed is sweet and rich, and the firm texture of the Sakhalin surf clam stimulates the appetite.

Blue Honeysuckle

Blue honeysuckle is harvested in July. It has a unique sour taste and is rich in vitamin C, calcium, and iron. It is also abundant in anthocyanin, an ingredient that reduces eye aging and fatigue. Many processed products such as sweets, jams, and juices are available.

They all look so good, you'll have a hard time deciding which one to try.



Oji Salmon is a high quality smoked salmon made with the choicest ingredients, smoked thoroughly, and processed as carefully as possible by hand.

Bisen is brewed using Tomakomai's nationally renowned source of tap water and Suisei sake rice from Atsuma, a rice-producing town.

Sakhalin Surf Clams

Tomakomai boasts the largest catch of Sakhalin surf clam in Japan and it has been designated as the shellfish of the city. The appeal of Sakhalin surf clam is its sweet taste, firm texture and juicy flavor. It contains high levels of taurine, which is good for the liver and dissolves blood clots, as well as glycine and alanine, which contribute to its delicious flavor.
